Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza

To date North Carolina has not had any instances of the Avian Influenza (HPAI), however as birds migrate south for the winter it is likely that they will bring it south with them. Ducks, geese, hawks, falcons and owls have all had reported cases. It is STRONGLY recommended that you confine your birds to indoors during migrating season (which is expected to be September and October), and have a specific pair of shoes that you wear around your birds and no where else. Definitely keep your birds away from surface water where migrating birds could land and keep rodents out of your feed. In addition, don't take your dog swimming and then let them return to areas your flock are exposed to until they've been bathed with soap.
